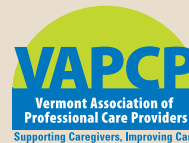

Green Mountain Care

You take care of others every day... Now it's time to care for yourself!

Vermont has a new public health insurance program called Green Mountain Care—a group of low-cost and free health coverage plans for Vermont residents. If you are a direct-care worker and do not have health coverage, you are probably eligible for one of these plans—*at little or no cost per month.*

Green Mountain Care has four different health coverage plans:

- **Catamount Health**
- **Vermont Health Access Plan (VHAP)**
- **Medicaid**
- **Dr. Dynasaur**

Green Mountain Care Plans

Catamount Health This comprehensive plan is for residents of Vermont who currently lack coverage for a variety of reasons. Eligibility and premium cost is based on income and household size.

Cost: As low as \$65 per month per person (for individuals earning less than \$1,742 per month). Individual Vermonters whose gross household income is more than \$2,553 a month can participate for \$393 per month. Co-payments may also apply.

Vermont Health Access Plan (VHAP) This coverage plan is for Vermont residents earning less than \$1,307 per month (age 18 and older) who currently lack coverage for a variety of reasons. Eligibility and premium cost is based on income.

Cost: \$0 to \$49 per person per month.
No co-payments.

Medicaid This plan provides low-cost or free coverage for low-income children, young adults under age 21, parents, pregnant women, caretaker relatives, people who are blind or disabled, and those age 65 or older. Eligibility is based on your income and resources (e.g. cash, bank accounts, etc.). In some cases, Vermonters enrolled in Medicare may also be eligible for Medicaid.

Cost: Depending on your eligibility category and income, you *may* have to pay a low out-of-pocket monthly premium, and co-payments for specific services.

Dr. Dynasaur This plan provides low-cost or free health coverage for children, teenagers under age 18, and pregnant women. Eligibility is based on income and family size.

Cost: \$0 to \$40 per child per month.
No co-payments.

How do I enroll?

Online: You can use the Screening Tool at the Green Mountain Care website (www.greenmountaincare.org) to find out which plan you are eligible for. You will need to download an application form, fill it out, and mail or fax it to the address listed on the application to enroll.

Telephone: Call **800.250.8427** (the Green Mountain Care Information Line) to find out what plan you are eligible for, to request an application, or to check the status of your application.
